

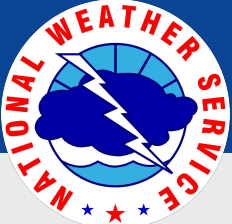


Severe Thunderstorms are possible Sunday, mainly afternoon-evening

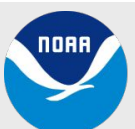
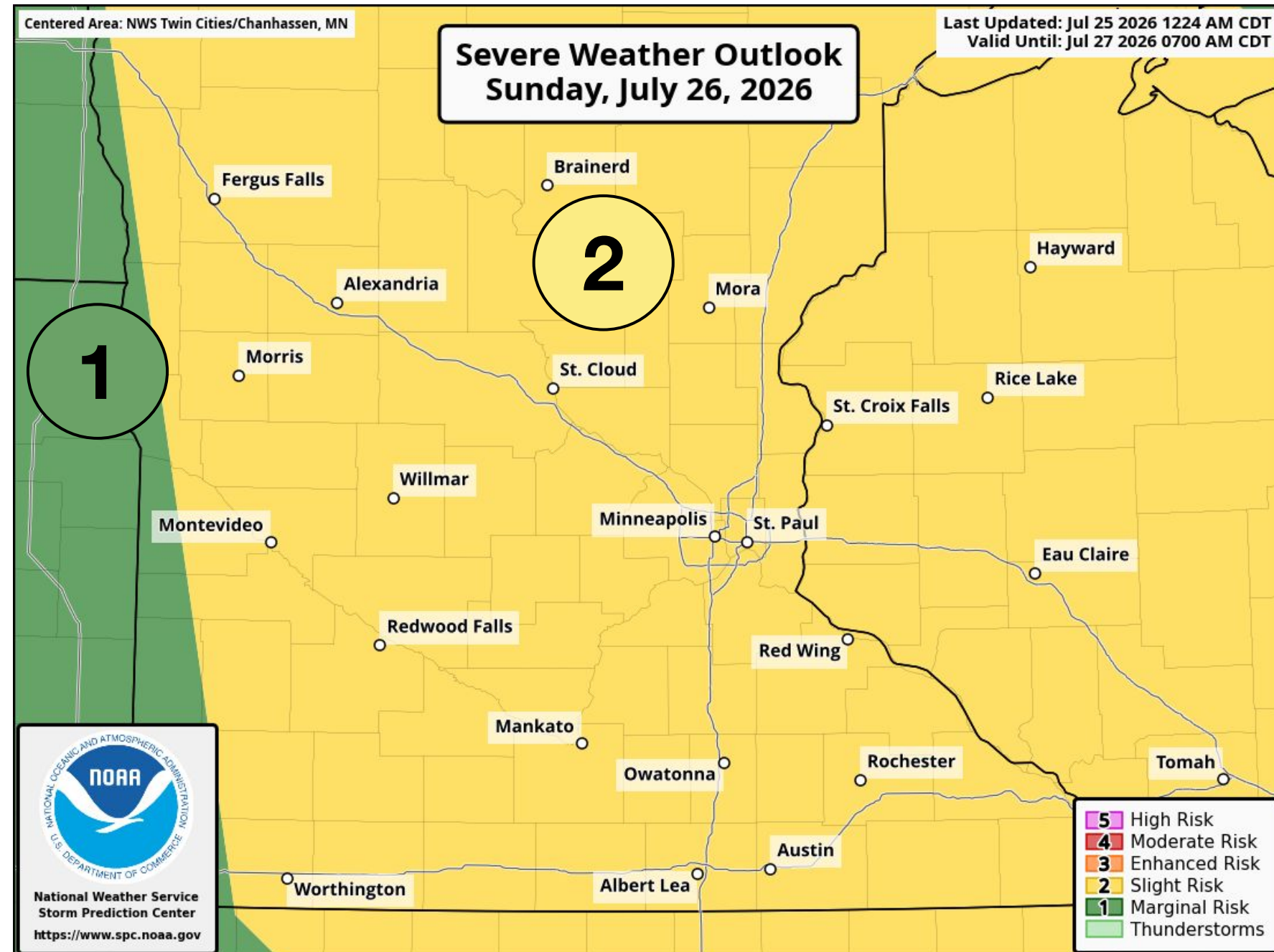
Best chance for storms over the next 7 days

Key Messages

- **Level 2 of 5 Risk** for severe storms across MN and WI.
- Forecasted environment would support large hail and damaging winds with any storms that develop.
- Confidence is low regarding exact timing and coverage.

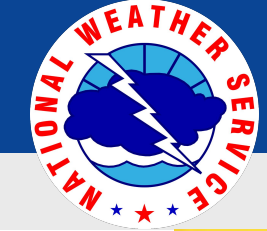

LOOK before you LOCK

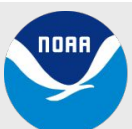


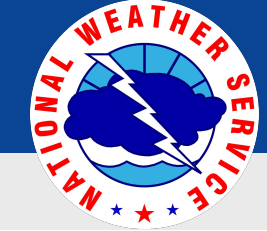
Outdoors
